LIVESTOCK

Compared to a week ago, fed cattle trade once again turned active last Thursday in all major feedlot regions and remained inactive afterward. On Thursday fed cattle in the Southern Plains were \$3.0-5.00 higher at \$112.00. In the Iowa Southern Minnesota Direct hog trade this week the weighted average price on Wednesday was \$.67 lower from last week at \$100.98. The estimated cutout value of Choice 600-900 lb. carcasses was \$.46 higher on the week at \$178.43 on Wednesday on light to moderate demand and offerings.

USDA CROP & WEATHER SUMMARY
(06/27/11)

Extreme heat continued in Oklahoma with average temperatures for the week in the 80's and average highs topping 100 degrees in some districts. Very little rainfall fell during the past week with a paltry statewide average of 0.11 of an inch. The U.S. Drought Monitor increased the area of D-4 or exceptional drought to almost a third of the state, as of June 21st. The drought and the accompanying heat and wind are continuing to deplete soil moisture. Farmers and ranchers are making tough decisions about planting row crops and livestock inventory levels. Topsoil and sub-soil moisture conditions were rated mostly very short with only 10 percent of the state rated adequate.

Small Grains: Harvest of all small grains was almost complete. Wheat harvest was 96 percent complete by Sunday, 16 points ahead of normal, with 44 percent of the ground plowed. The rye harvest was virtually complete by week's end, with 46 percent of the ground plowed. Oats in the soft dough stage reached 96 percent complete, while 87 percent of the crop had been harvested, and 35 percent of the ground was plowed by Sunday. Canola was 98 percent harvested by the end of the week, up eight points from the previous week.

Row Crops: The heat and drought continued to impact the condition of all row crops, especially cotton which was rated mostly poor to very poor. Forty-eight percent of corn was silking by the end of the week, 14 points ahead of the five-year average. Planting of sorghum was 93 percent complete, while 80 percent of the crop had emerged. Soybean planting was 89 percent complete with 75 percent of the crop emerged by Sunday. Peanut emergence was 91 percent complete by week's end, and five percent of the crop was pegging, significantly behind normal. Cotton planting was virtually complete by the end of the week. Seventy-two percent of the crop had emerged, and five percent was squaring, both behind the five-year average.

Miscellaneous Crops: Sixty-eight percent of the watermelon crop was setting fruit by Sunday, eight points ahead of normal.

Hay: Second cuttings of alfalfa reached 69 percent complete and first cuttings of other hay reached 60 percent complete, both behind the five-year average. Conditions for all hay were rated mostly in the fair to very poor range. Hay supplies for the season were rated below average for 77 percent of the state, a concern for livestock producers.

Pasture: and range conditions were rated mostly fair to poor. Livestock conditions were rated mostly fair to good. The limited availability of grazing and hay, along with low pond levels led to continued reports of producers selling off livestock.

Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers mostly 3.00 to 8.00 higher; few early sales traded steady. Demand good for all classes. Last week's higher live cattle trade and futures rally has improved demand for feeder cattle. Summer is certainly here in Oklahoma as temperatures continue to surpass 100 degrees. Supply included 97 percent over 600 lbs; 49 percent heifers.

Unless otherwise stated prices are FOB weigh point with a 2-3 percent shrink or equivalent and with a 5-10 cent slide on calves and 3-6 cent slide on yearlings from base weights. Current sales up to 14 days for delivery.
