- 4. Keep NPIP flock segregated from other poultry.
- 5. Allow a State Poultry Inspector to inspect premises and check test a percentage of the flock.
- 6. Pass Clean Premises Inspection..
- 7. Remit a \$25.00 flock fee with each annual application and test (if test is required) along with any required testing fee. ODAFF Pullorum-Typhoid testing fees: 1-49 birds, \$1.00/bird. 50-99 birds, .75/bird. 100-300 birds, .50/bird.

Any testing fee required by a Private Certified Poultry Tester is to be paid to the Private Tester not ODAFF

Every animal that is imported or exported in or out of the United States, requires either a CVI (Certificate of Veterinarian Inspection) or a NPIP 9-3 Form for poultry. It is the responsibility of the Veterinarian to make sure that the import regulations are met when they complete a CVI. However, when shipping poultry and using a 9-3 Form in lieu of the CVI, it becomes the responsibility of the NPIP Flock Owner to make sure the import regulations are met for each state. Some states require a special Import Permit to ship poultry into their state.

The NPIP 9-3 forms for shipping poultry out of state are available at no charge electronically. A NPIP Flock owner should contact our office via email to sherrie.davis@ag.ok.gov requesting approval to submit 9-3 via the NPIP database PRIOR to any out of state shipments. You must complete a 9-3 for each shipment out of Oklahoma. You must be approved by our office before any shipments are made out of Oklahoma. A copy of each shipment is automatically sent to our office as well as the state of destination, illiminating any paperwork having to be sent to our office. Paper forms are available upon request (if online requests are not an option) by contacting our office at 405-522-6139.

Now underneath the heading 'What are you IMPORTING into the United States?' you will see a header Animal or Animal Product and click on State Regulations and Import Requirements. About half way down the page is a heading that states 'to locate Import regulations for a particular state, please select the appropriate State from the following list:' Click the state you are shipping to and you will be directed to that states Department of Agriculture's website. Look for Animal import requirements for poultry. Contact your state of destination
