Bird Health 1. New birds or hatching eggs added to the farm are from another NPIP PT Clean flock or birds tested negative before entry (make list from last 12 months in remarks).				
2. Records (log book which include date, name, address & phone number, types of birds) of in-coming and out-going birds or hatching eggs are maintained for 2 years and available for inspector to review.				
3. The participating flock, its eggs, and all equipment used in connection with the flock are kept separate from non-NPIP birds.				
4. Birds appear healthy				
Pen and enclosures/structures 1. The immediate vicinity around poultry/pens/enclosures/structures is neat, orderly, sanitary, and with no debris/clutter or overgrown vegetation within 30 feet of pens/enclosures/structures. 2. Pens are sturdy and secure, with no gaps or weak points where birds could escape, or predators could enter.				
3.Pen doors/gates or openings of the pen are easy to operate but secure enough to prevent accidental escapes.				
4. Bird proof locks or latches are present on the doors/gates.				
5. The pen/enclosure provides enough room for the birds to move freely.				
6. Ventilation is adequate to prevent the build up of stale air, moisture, and ammonia.				
7. The pen materials are safe for birds, absent of any toxic materials such as lead based paints or treated wood, and safe for birds to peck at.				
8. Enclosures/structures that house birds such as barns or sheds are free from inside debris and not used for storage of other items.				

<u>Equipment</u>				
1. All poultry equipment is sanitary/clean and in good working order.				
2. Incubator walls, floors, and trays are kept free from debris.				
3. Hatchers and trays are cleaned and disinfected after each use.				
4. Tops of incubators and hatchers are kept clean and not used for storage.				
5. No birds are located in the incubator and hatcher rooms except for the ones inside the incubators/hatchers.				
Feed and Litter				
Feed is kept contained in bins and any feed spills are cleaned up to prevent attraction of wild birds, rodents, or other wildlife.				
2. Litter isn't abnormally wet or soiled.				
3. Litter removal and replacement is frequent enough to keep ammonia levels normal.				
4. Litter depth is adequate.				
5. Recommended product guidelines for litter additives are followed.				
6. Drinking water and waterer is clean with minimal sedimient.				
<u>Premises</u>				
1. Have wild waterfowl been seen on the premise at any time? If yes, is there a biosecurity plan to prevent direct contact of domestic birds with wild waterfowl?				
2. Are there ponds or other water sources on the premises? If yes, is there a biosecurity plan to prevent access to the area or contact with wild waterfowl?
